

THIS MONTH IN THE COUNSELING ROOM

This month in the counseling room we are talking about **problem solving**. Appropriate and positive problem solving is a critical life skill that can help students be successful personally and academically. It helps them navigate daily decisions and conflict. Students will be learning basic steps to problem solving:

- 1. Identify the problem.
- 2. List the possible solutions or courses of action.
- 3. Weigh the possible solutions.
- 4. Choose a solution to try.
- 5. Put the solution into practice.
- 6. Evaluate the solution.
